

Lake Placid Institute's summer programs

LAKE PLACID — The Lake Placid Institute for the Arts and Humanities has completed a successful winter/spring season of programs, also unveiling a new website with a fresh look and feel, and kicking off an exceptionally dynamic summer of programs called "It's Summer."

The new website at www.lakeplacidinstitute.org is designed to help people navigate the Institute's mission and programs, and showcases the aesthetic of the artists whose work the Institute supports.

"It's Summer: The Schedule" kicks off with the Institute's annual Great Adirondack Young People's Poetry Contest awards ceremony at 2 p.m. today at the Northwoods Inn, followed by

"It's Summer: The Party," a cocktail reception with silent auction on July 2 at the Whiteface Club and Resort, co-chaired by Board members Beth Amorosi and Lex Dashnaw.

The schedule continues in July and August with a full agenda of three Adirondack Roundtables and the week-long Chamber Music Seminar.

Throughout the winter and spring, the Institute hosts an Art Book Group at the Library, meeting on the first Monday of each month with the final group meeting on June 28. All programs are open to the local community — year-round and seasonal residents, and visitors.

Philanthropist, educator and writer Eileen Rockefeller kicks off the speakers on July

18, followed by David Childs, senior architect of the architectural and design firm Skidmore, Owings & Merrill and architect of the Freedom Tower on Aug. 8. Next is Chief Scientist of NASA and director of their space station program, Ellen Stofan on Aug. 15.

"We are thrilled with this summer's Adirondack Roundtable series, the growing attendance and great audience response to the program over the years," said board member Mara Jayne Miller. "Led by Chair Emeritus John C. Bogle, this year will celebrate Roundtable's 12th birthday. To be presenting such "world-beaters" — a writer, philanthropist, architect, aeronautical scientist — from three such differing disciplines is at the heart of the Lake Placid Institute's mission and goal. It illustrates perfectly what we do and why. We couldn't be more pleased!"

Roundtables are held at 8:30 a.m. with a buffet breakfast at the Mountain View Room of the Visitors and Conference Center on Main Street.

The Chamber Music Seminar runs during the week of Aug. 8-12, culminating with a faculty concert at the Northwoods Inn on Aug. 12.

The Institute's Art Book Group reads themed art-related books including recently

"Michelangelo and the Pope's Ceiling," "The Woman in Gold" and a book on the art of Winslow Homer. The group, resuming in September and open to new members, also makes regular visits to regional museums and art centers as a means of expanding the context of what is read during the year.

In April, LPI held its fourth and most successful theatre party in New York City, the Broadway show "An American in Paris," nominated for 12 Tony Awards, which was followed by a dinner at ORSO.

Supporters and patrons from Lake Placid and the surrounding areas came together to raise funds for the Institute's programs that provide a source of intellectual and cultural enrichment to the local community.


